## Prayer of Great Thanksgiving

God, you created the world,

## Suggested Scriptures

### Psalm 139:13–16 *ESV*

For you formed my inward parts;  
you knitted me together in my mother's womb.  
I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made.  
Wonderful are your works;  
my soul knows it very well.  
My frame was not hidden from you,  
when I was being made in secret,  
intricately woven in the depths of the earth.  
Your eyes saw my unformed substance;  
in your book were written, every one of them,  
the days that were formed for me,  
when as yet there was none of them.

### Mark 10:13–16 *ESV*

And they were bringing children to him  
that he might touch them, and the disciples  
rebuked them. But when Jesus saw it,  
he was indignant and said to them,  
“Let the children come to me; do not  
hinder them, for to such belongs the  
kingdom of God. Truly, I say to you,  
whoever does not receive the kingdom  
of God like a child shall not enter it.”  
And he took them in his arms and  
blessed them, laying his hands on them.
